Bideman had bro't up the press to the Bluffs,
Pres. Hyde called for Pres. Geo. A. Smith as a

witness

Pres. Geo. A. Smith said he knew nothing about the press.. He had advised Mr Molholand if there was anything of the kind, they had better better be careful, had better remove it and quit the business, said he did not deny
