Record of tithing donations and "offerings for the poor" received by Jacob G. Bigler, bishop of the Kanesville Branch, and Aaron Johnson, presiding bishop of Pottawattamie County, Iowa, October 1849-January 1852. Includes information about distributions to the poor of Kanesville and vicinity and an account of labor and materials donated toward the construction of the Log Tabernacle, 1849-1850. Also contains a brief section entitled "Bishops Docket," which reports ecclesiastical court cases brought before Bishop William W. Lane and his counselors, Jacob G. Bigler and Lorenzo Johnson, 1850-1851.
