Minutebook and papers related to high council meetings, including high council courts. Most of the minutes were recorded by the council's clerk, Evan M. Greene. Some of the minutes in folder 2 were recorded by Jacob G. Bigler. Included in the minutebook are Oliver Cowdery's 5 November 1848 statement upon returning to the Church. Following the minutes are lists of liquor licenses granted (1848) and marriages performed (1846-1848).

sentiments, and called for a vote expressive of the feelings of this

Council and the representation of the church or branches, in this

county., The feelings of the Council and people were unanimous

in favor of their expressions.. Several of the Counsellors spake on

the different subjects pertaining to the welfare of the people

William Parks wanted some advice concerning his

family affairs,, was refered to the bishop..

Elder Hyde spake on dancing and wanted to know if the people

were willing to let the Council and 1st bishop and

authorities

have a party without their diving in to dancing, as they had not

On motion of Jas, Allred they voted that the High Council head
