Kanesville Log Nov. 5th 1848

By Especial Request the High Council met

This day with the High Priest Quorum in the

Log Tabernacle., The council all present..

The meeting was opened by Bro. William Snow Pres. of the High Priest Quorum..

Pres. O. Hyde and a letter he had just received from Bro. Samuel Heath presiding Elder at Cincinatti, Bro. Heath informed him,, that Bro. Whitehead had been in that city and after being kindly received by the Brethren and Sisters and made welcom to their hospitality he had tried to seduce three of the Sisters.. Bro. Hyde then read his reply in which he[------] the conduct of Bro. Whitehead, ordered him suspended from fel-

lowship

and silenced from preaching and ordered him to return home, and do no more church business

Says he will not spare any man that will con-

duct himself in that way.. The meeting voted to sustain Bro. Hyde in that, and have the letter sent

Remarks from Bro/ Geo. A Smith E. T. Benson & others,,

on this subject...

Bro. Hyde them spake relative to liquor and dancing,,

said there had been member of applications
for dancing schools, dancing parties &c, but now
for prayer meetings, fast meeting, &c said untill he saw

a spirit of contrition and a hungering and thirsting after

the spirit of the Lord, he could not grant permissions on

those applications,, said every man has a right to dance,

but he that will not abide the council of the church will

be severed from the church.. Bro. W. Snow spake on this subject.

Bro. O. Hyde then presented the case of Bro. Oliver

Cowdery,, who was present, and requested him to speak

to the people, and let them know his feeling as he wished

as he wished to come back onto the church, and be one with us again.. The congregation expressed, by vote

their desire to hear from Bro. Oliver Cowdery..
